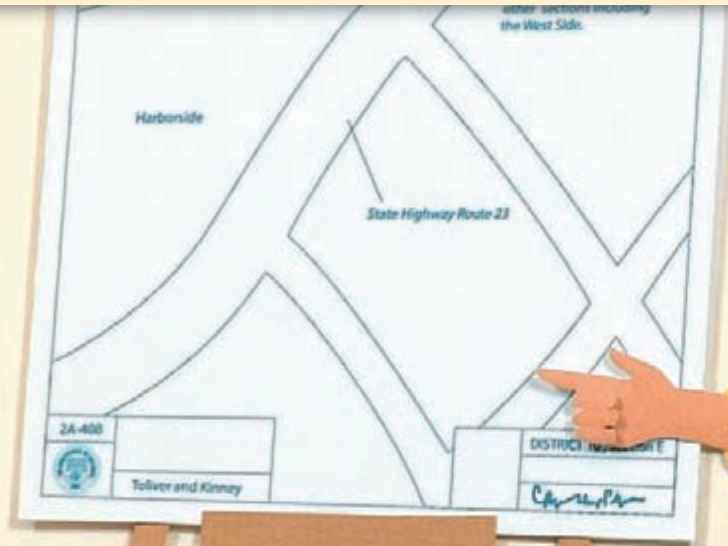

-  Today I will visit her at work.

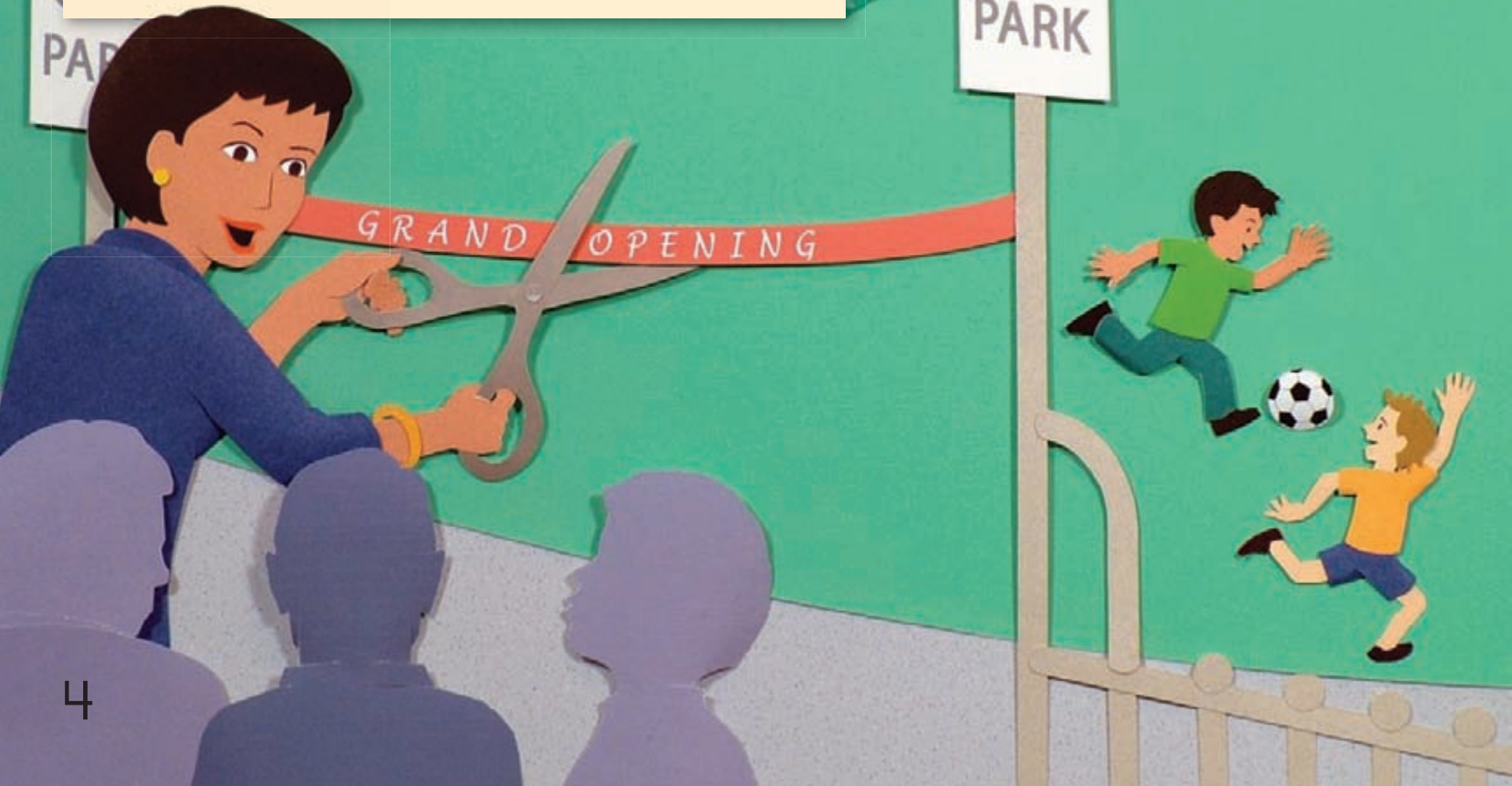


- First we go to a meeting.

- Mom cuts a ribbon. I can play.

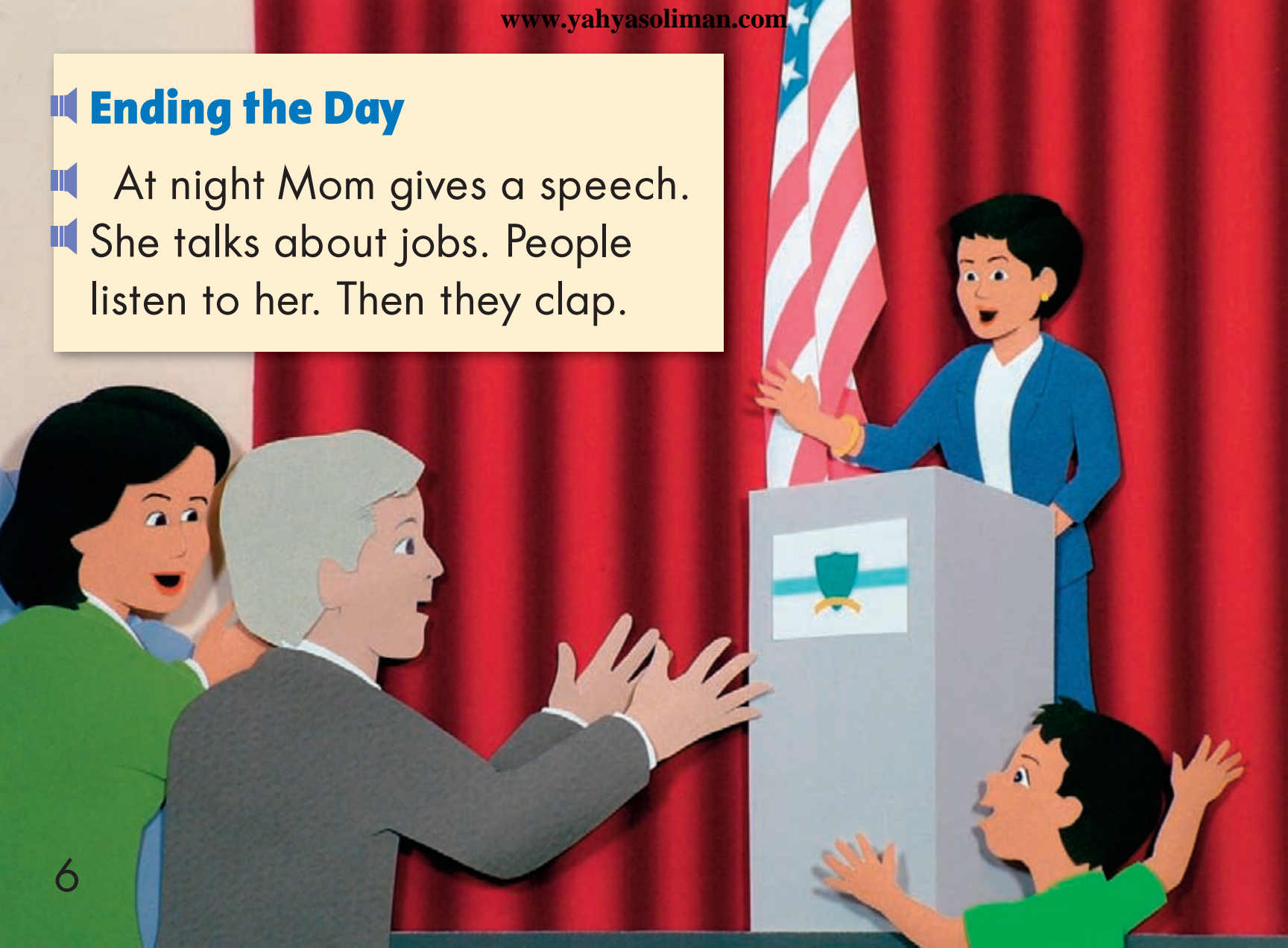


- Then we help with a race.
