









Consonant Nn





Response to Literature: Bear's Busy Family








Comprehension Skill: Characters

Ask children to name the letters by the pig at the top of the page. Have them find and circle the Pp's on the page. Then have them trace and write P and p in the space provided.






























Literature Response: What Will Mommy Do When I'm at School?










Relate Pp to /p/

Ask children to name the letters by the alligator at the top of the page. Have them find and circle Aa's on the page. Then have them trace and write A and a on the line.

















Comprehension Skill: Make Predictions




High-Frequency Words: I, a, my, the, go

Have children cut out the words on the side of page 21 and paste them in the appropriate boxes. On page 22, ask them to trace the high-frequency words. Then have them read the completed story.































Literature Response: Compare Texts
